5. Centre Facilities

• Buildings and grounds

Modbury Kindergarten is located in a quiet suburban street in Modbury North. The centre was purpose built and has flexible learning spaces that allow for small and large group learning. A spacious verandah is used as an extension fo the learning environment as it is protected by outdoor blinds, enabling play in all weather.

The outdoor environment is extensive, allowing space for large group games and active play. The outdoor and indoor learning environment have been enhanced by recent improvements which have been designed to extend and challenge children through play.

- Access for children and staff with disabilities: Access through the rear of the centre is enabled by a wheelchair accessible ramp.
